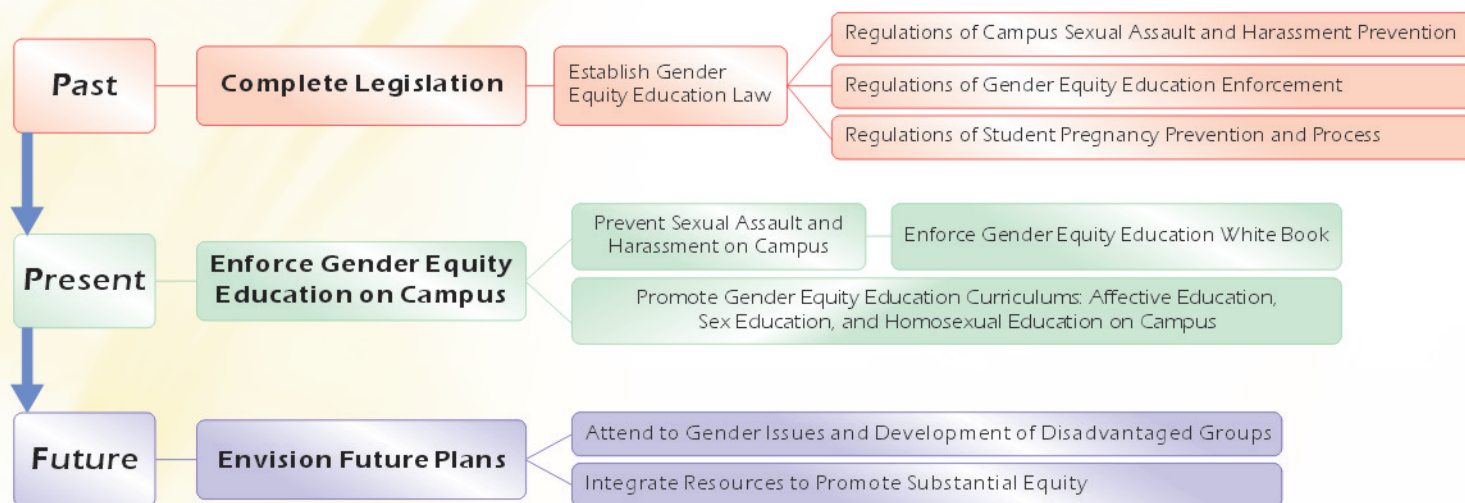


Achievements and Visions of the Committee



Little Knowledge, Big Protection

- Q** I am a little girly; my voice is soft; however, my classmates often tease my appearance and question my sexuality. After class, they often drag me to the toilet to check my sex. Those behaviors make me extremely uncomfortable and I don't want to go to school any more. What should I do?

A Don't worry about that. According to the twelfth and fourteenth articles of the Gender Equity Education Law, the school authorities ought to respect everyone's gender characteristics. You can ask for help from Office of Students' Affairs on campus to correct their behavior.
- Q** My period is late this month. I am pregnant and my belly enlarges gradually. However, I would like to continue my education. What should I do?

A If you have any questions, you can ask for help from Office of Student Counseling on campus. According to the fourteenth article of the Gender Equity Education Law, school authorities have to protect students' rights of education and must provide assistance if necessary.
- Q** Some classmates or teachers often talk about something which makes me uneasy, or have physical contact with me which makes me feel uncomfortable. What should I do?

A When you face this situation, you should say "NO". According to the thirtieth article of the Gender Equity Education Law, school authorities should prevent and investigate cases of sexual harassment or sexual assault which happen on campus, in order to avoid depriving students of their rights.
